



Information for Candidates webpage

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Minimum expectations (of candidates)

All candidates must meet the following minimum expectations:

- 1. Attend a Candidate Briefing: AND
- 2. Submit a manifesto (including a photo); AND
- 3. Attend a Campaigning and Social Media workshop

Please note: Failure to meet the above 3 minimum expectations will result in <u>your application being</u> <u>withdrawn</u> and you no longer running in the election

Current full-time and part-time officers:

Any current full-time or part-time officers who are running for re-election are also required to attend an extra formal briefing to explain some additional rules and regulations that apply to ensure fairness for all candidates. All re-running officers must attend this briefing, failure to do so could result in your application being withdrawn

Candidate Briefings: All candidates must attend ONE (of four)

Briefing for re-running officers: All current full-time and part-time officers who are re-running must attend

Candidate Question Time: All candidates must attend

5.30-7.30pm Tues 27th Feb (candidates to arrive by 5pm)

Results Night: All candidates must attend

• 5.30pm Fri 8th Mar 2024 (results announced at 6pm)
