Volunteer Role:	Reverse Mentoring Scheme participant	
Role overview:		
The Reverse Mentoring Scheme is a pilot project that aims to build greater connections between the University's Senior Management Team (SMT) and the student body.		
The scheme will provide students with an opportunity to find out more about leadership and professional life and career development as well as providing members of SMT with a greater understanding of how London Metropolitan is experienced by students on a day to day basis.		
Reverse Mentoring Scheme participants will be placed in a group with 2 other students and one member of SMT and will meet 2-3 times over the course of Semester 2. All participants will be provided with initial training and ongoing support to ensure that you get the most out of the scheme.		
Location:	London Metropolitan University: various locations with the possibility of some remote sessions	
Time commitment:	Approx 6 hours in total, including attendance at a training session on Wednesday 23rd March 2022 9am-11.30am and approximately 2-3 mentoring sessions from March 2022 to May 2022

Useful abilities and previous experience:	No previous training or experience is required, but a passion for ensuring the voice of students is heard at London Met and an interest in leadership and career development would be advantageous. You will need to be open and dependable, as well as being a good communicator and listener	

Role requirements:	 To attend and actively participate in 2-3 scheduled mentoring group sessions To work closely with other members of your mentoring group to identify shared goals and agree topics for discussion To attend an initial training session and engage with ongoing support and evaluation mechanisms To treat all group members with respect and kindness and uphold the values and underlying principles as set out in the <u>Student</u> <u>Partnership Agreement</u> To take reasonable care of the health and safety of yourself, other people and resources whilst volunteering and to comply with LMSU and University Health and Safety Policies, Codes of Practice and local arrangements
What's in it for you:	The role provides an opportunity to gain a unique experience into the leadership at LondonMet and to work collectively to achieve shared goals. You get as much out of it as you put in! Some of the skills you can gain include: Access to a mentor Networking skills Community building Cultural awareness Decision-making Interpersonal and communication Problem-solving Public speaking skills Teamwork The scheme will also help to provide you with an understanding of some elements of professional life and career planning as well as other matters which may be of particular relevance to your course or field of interest. As well as offering you a chance to enhance your C.V., you will receive a certificate at the conclusion of your role and your contribution will be formally recognised on your degree transcript
