Student Reps

Student Reps are elected by fellow students on their course to represent student's views and to raise issues related to their academic experience to their school and the University.

As well as providing direct feedback from students to course leaders and other staff members, they are encouraged to organise students on the ground to identify and discuss relevant issues. Student Reps act as the voice of students and provide that essential liaison between the schools and students.

What do they do?

- Represent the views of students on their course
- Listen to students and raise issues on their behalf
- Attend course committee meetings to represent student views and raise their issues
- Regularly meet up with course leaders and other academics to discuss solutions to issues
- Work closely with the sabbatical officers and hub committee members who represent each school

They can also:

- Be an active part of the Students' Union by getting involved in our other activities and events such as student council, general meetings, sports, societies and media
- Be elected as full-time, paid sabbatical officer! Sabbatical officers represent one or two schools each. Get in contact for more information



Why should you become a Student Rep?

- It's a chance to make a difference, learn new skills and meet new people
- To be directly involved in improving the student
 experience on courses and teaching at London Met
- To leave London Met with more than just a degree

How do I become a Student Rep?

Your course leader will brief you with regards to Student Reps at the beginning of each semester. For more details ask your course leader.

Do postgraduate courses have Student Reps too?

Yes! All postgraduate courses have Student Reps too.

Expectations and commitment:

As a Student Rep, you will also be expected to attend a training session, your course committee meetings and the Student Rep forums. You will also need to spend some time speaking to your course mates, raising issues with teaching staff and liaising with the Students' Union. You will need to have enough time to devote to the role so please bare this in mind before putting yourself forward.

What are Student Rep school forums?

These are forums held each semester for Student Reps from a particular school to meet together with the Students' Union officers, staff and management of the school. It is an opportunity for Student Reps to raise issues directly with the head of school and other senior staff members and to network with other Student Reps.
